With both hands in front of your body, toss one tissue up from the right hand to the left and catch. Then, toss it up with the left and catch with the right. 2. Now have a tissue in each hand. Toss up from right hand to left. Before you catch with the left, toss that tissue up to the right hand. 3. Now put two tissues in the right hand and one in the left. Toss one tissue up from your right hand to your left. Before you catch with the left, toss the tissue in that hand up to the right hand. Before you catch with the right,
